Parent Information

Dear Parents,

As we begin tryouts for the **Campbell Junior Spartans Basketball Feeder Program**, we would like to share some important information about our program and the expectations for all participants and families.

Cobb County Schools do not offer middle school basketball programs. The Campbell Junior Spartans program exists to help fill that need by providing student-athletes with the opportunity to develop their basketball skills while preparing them for future participation in the Campbell High School basketball program. Our coaches and administrators are dedicated volunteers who invest their time and experience into helping our players grow both on and off the court.

The Campbell Junior Spartans compete in one of the area's most competitive feeder basketball leagues, facing programs representing high schools in Cobb, Cherokee, Douglas, Fulton, Forsyth, and Paulding counties. During the season, teams typically:

- Practice approximately three evenings each week.
- Play approximately 35 games throughout the season.
- Compete in the league championship tournament, which concludes in early February.

Competitive Program Expectations

The Campbell Junior Spartans is a **competitive basketball program**, not a recreational league. As a result:

- There is **no minimum playing time requirement**.
- Playing time is earned through effort, attitude, attendance, preparation, and performance.
- Games are played at a highly competitive level and are generally more physical than recreational basketball.

Families seeking a recreational basketball experience should consider one of the many excellent recreation leagues offered throughout Cobb County.

Commitment

Participation on a Campbell Junior Spartans team requires a significant commitment from both players and their families.

We understand that our athletes have academic responsibilities, family obligations, and other activities. However, players who accept a roster position are expected to honor their commitment to their teammates and coaches by making basketball a priority during the season and managing their schedules responsibly.

If an unavoidable family or academic conflict arises, we ask that players communicate with their coach as early as possible so appropriate arrangements can be made.

Program Funding

The Campbell Junior Spartans Basketball Program is **not a school-sponsored activity**. While Campbell High School and our feeder schools generously allow us to rent their gymnasiums, the program is independently operated and receives no financial support from the school district.

Operating expenses—including league fees, officials, gym rentals, equipment, uniforms, insurance, and other program costs—are funded entirely through player registration fees and fundraising efforts.

We never want financial circumstances to prevent a qualified player from participating. Families experiencing financial hardship are encouraged to speak with us. Fundraising opportunities are available to help offset program costs so that every player who earns a roster spot has the opportunity to participate.

We appreciate your interest in the Campbell Junior Spartans Basketball Program and look forward to an exciting and rewarding season. Thank you for your commitment to helping us build young men and women of character through the game of basketball.
